



Further, Government has set up the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) as a Public Private Partnership entity to promote private training providers to set up Skill Development Centres across the Country. NSDC, an industry led 'Not For Profit Company' acts as a catalyst in a skill development by providing the fund received from National Skill Development Fund (NSDF) to enterprises, companies and organisations that provide skill training. The details of the funds allocated/spent by the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) for different activities related to skill development across the Country for the current financial year 2015-16 are as under:-

Further, Government through National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) has constituted and operationalised 33 Sector Skill Councils (SSCs) which are industry led bodies intended to align the skilling efforts as per the industry's requirement. The SSCs with representation from industry, academia and State/UT Government, prescribe the National Occupational Standards (NOS) and Qualification Packs (QPs) based on which the training is imparted. As on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2016, these 33 SSCs have developed 4323 unique National Occupational Standards (NOSs) for 1644 Job Roles align to the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF), to provide employable skills to youths.

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
